DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

At Our Lady of Sorrows April 7, 2013 2:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.

<u>Overview of the Devotion:</u> There are usually four items associated with the devotion of Divine Mercy, the <u>Image</u>, the <u>Feast</u>, the <u>Chaplet</u> and the <u>Hour of Mercy</u>.

The Image: It takes its origin from a vision that St. Faustina had in Plock on February 22,1931. In that vision Christ expressed his desire to have such an image painted and that the words in the signature beneath it be: Jesus, I trust in you. The Image represents crucifixion. From the pierced Heart, not visible in the image, two rays issue forth, red and pale. Jesus explained their meaning: the red stands for the Blood (Eucharist), which is the life of souls. The pale ray stands for the water (Baptism) that makes souls righteous. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross (299).

<u>The Feast:</u> According to Jesus' wish, the Feast of Mercy is to be celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Jesus is showing the close connection between the Easter mystery of man's redemption and this feast. The Feast of Mercy is not only a day designated for the worship of God's mercy, but also a day of grace for all people, particularly for sinners. Jesus attached grate promises to the feast. One is the promise of complete forgiveness of sins and punishment, in other words, this grace is equal to the one we received in the sacrament of Baptism, it offers a completely new beginning.
